
National Service Structure





Target area


Predominately Land Bank Properties with situational assistance to the City of Muskegon Heights.

Land Bank AmeriCorps Scoreboard




Muskegon USC

Defined new Neighborhoods




OPERATING AN AMERICORPS PROGRAM

Host organizations must:

- Employ one FTE staff for program management
- Provide required match funds
- Fully manage the program at the local level
- Identify and support service sites
- Recruit and manage its own AmeriCorps members
- Manage payment of AmeriCorps member living stipends
- Track and report progress toward program goals
- Require AmeriCorps staff to attend mandatory trainings
- Participate in statewide member events and activities
